#### ULV School of Nursing Articulation Plan (SONAP)

All registered nurses with an active, unencumbered RN license issued by the CA Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) may be awarded up to 60 credit hours.

\*Credit of Prior learning (CPL) - Registered nurses with unencumbered active CA RN license, and two years of nursing experience may be awarded up to 8-credit hours towards electives.

#### Baccalaureate Degree Requirement: The La Verne Experience (LVE)
