**ULV School of Nursing Articulation Plan (SONAP)**

All registered nurses with an active, unencumbered RN license issued by the CA Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) may be awarded up to 60 credit hours.

\*Credit of Prior learning (CPL) - Registered nurses with unencumbered active CA RN license, and two years of nursing experience may be awarded up to 8-credit hours towards electives.

**Baccalaureate Degree Requirement: The La Verne Experience (LVE)**

The La Verne Experience is centered on integrating the curriculum through learning communities, connecting classroom theory to real-world practices, and infusing Community Engagement throughout the educational experience. Students satisfy this requirement by taking the following (4) courses.

1. Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (LVDI) 1 course (4 credits) – (HSM 306 satisfy ULV requirement)
2. University Values (LVUV) 1 course (4 credits) – (NURS 325 course satisfy ULV requirement)
3. Community Engagement (LVCS) 1 course (4 credits) - (NURS 465 satisfy ULV requirement)
4. University Reflection (LVUR) 1 course (4 credits) - (NURS 499 satisfy ULV requirement)
